5 Tips on staying calm in the water

1. Stay Ready Your Breathing and Talk to Yourself!
2. Don't Look At Their Heads
3. Keep Your Hands to Yourself!
4. Accept That You're In Their Territory. You're Not on the Menu.
5. Act Natural. Losing your cool & breathing weird is the easiest way to put the shark off its food chain.

Before diving with sharks, gather some info.

1. Search for a dive buddy.
Any location with good diving has one or more dive shops. These local professionals know the sites and dangers better than anyone.
2. Check the weather.
Some important questions to know are "Does it storm regularly?" or "Have I been asked if I'm at this location?"
3. Let your diver know if you are a beginner.
On your first visit it is better to go with a dive operator.
4. Listen carefully.
Before the dive the instructor will confirm that you (or coach) tell you:

- WHERE YOU ARE INTENDING TO RELATION TO THE SITE
- WHERE YOU WILL BE GOING HOW LONG YOU WILL BE THERE
- WHAT THE MAX DEPTH WILL BE
- WHAT SIGNALS YOU WILL USE
- WHAT TO DO IF YOU NEED TO LEAVE THE DIVE EARLY
- WHAT SIGNS YOU WILL SEE AND
- HOW LONG A SAFETY STOP YOU WILL DO IF IT SHOULD BE AT LEAST 3 MINUTES
